What networking opportunities will I have besides 1 on 1 networking which gives preference to seniors?

Table Fair that opens the event is open to all students, and there also will be 15-minute periods at the end of each information session and panel for students to engage with employers. We will also have an open networking session at the end of the day where remaining employers and students can gather to network.

What should I wear?

What should I bring?

Bring copies of your resume, your nametag and event schedule (both of which can be picked up at student check-in), a pen, and a positive attitude.

Plan accordingly. Get to Moody early so you can get lunch BEFORE you go up to Ballator to meet employers or plan to eat a bit later.

What if I have class at the time of a session I really want to attend?

Your academics come first, but depending on what is happening in class that day (especially if you are a senior on the job market), you might want to ask your faculty if you may arrive late/leave early to make the session, or if there is any make up option for that class. If it doesn't seem likely, see Q and A below.

What if my class schedule doesn't allow me to attend at all?

This is just the beginning of our employer connections, not the end. You are welcome to follow up with all representatives directly after Tuesday, March 5 – just let them know your schedule didn't allow you to attend; share your interest and resume. Again, How Do I Get There? or Creating Connections workshops will coach you through this networking and outreach process.
