

Growing up in Fairbanks, Alaska, Savannah Scott noticed how factors like poverty and housing insecurity were taking a toll on the health of her community. She believed that studying pre-med was her best way to make a difference, until a Hollins professor encouraged her to enroll in the Introduction to Public Health course.

After completing several significant internships, Savannah was eventually put in touch with a CDC official who helped her apply for the CDC's Public Health Associate program. She was accepted and selected to return to Fairbanks and serve with the Tanana Chiefs Conference, an Alaska Native nonprofit organization—a move that she calls “my journey back home.”

Zahin worked closely with a faculty sponsor during the rigorous application process and went on to create a first-year seminar at Hollins with a focus on “Sustainability and Social Innovation.” She graduated from Hollins in three years and joined a legal firm while exploring Ph.D. programs in higher education and policy reform.


